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**The Town's Budget Process**

Over the past few months I have been reporting on the budget process and the various departments involved. This month I will focus on the Highway Department and other departments managed by the Department of Public Works (DPW) Director.

**Highway Department**  
The Highway Department office is open Monday through Friday, 7 am to 3:30 pm. The Highway Director is available 24 hours a day. The Director's work is organized by highway emergency. The town is currently in the process of completing the annual budget for 2018. The Highway Director's budget for 2018 was \$100,200, which is a 3.3 percent increase over the 2017 budget. The department has five full-time employees: Michael Chiodo, Director of Public Works; Richard Chiodo, Foreman and equipment operator; Robert Knight, Chief; Paul and Robert Miller. The director of public works is responsible for managing the department's operations. He also oversees all town contracts including the Emergency Response Training Center and the Roadway Committee. The director is responsible for reviewing day-to-day operations and maintenance of the department's equipment. The department also oversees the planning, purchasing, and planning work.

The Highway Department is based at 113 Main Street in an office building occupied by the Town Office. The department is currently in the process of completing the annual budget for 2018.
