

There will be outside vendors as well offering many and various goods for sale. Mark your calendars for time and place; we look forward to seeing everyone again!



Got Lunch Program

In 2013, Got Lunch began providing bags of food to children experiencing food insecurity in the Jaffrey Rindge communities to cover the weeks when school is not in session. The program expanded to add weekend bags during the school year and a pantry at the middle and high schools. Starting in January of 2021, many of our Got Lunch families were grateful for the help during the height of the pandemic and requested to continue the deliveries until they could get back on their feet again. So, with the support of our volunteers, we continued to provide weekly emergency grocery bag deliveries to children that needed help through the end of school year.



During the Easter Season we were thrilled to be able to provide the Got Lunch kids with a small Easter surprise along with a ham to share with their families!



At the end of the school year, Got Lunch forged through and implemented our regular weekly summer delivery program. Our summer program just ended on August 26th. Since January 2021, we have covered 1,600 miles in our delivery efforts and have delivered 1,486 bags! That is approximately 17,832 meals provided to children in need.

Our food program is 100% run by volunteers and is grateful to all who process enrollments, prepare the routes, organize the inventory, pick up hundreds of pounds of food from the Food Bank and from Hannaford, bag the food and deliver the bags to the homes of the children. We have successfully provided this service because of the generous support we have received. We are confident we will be able to provide help to all children who seek to participate in Got Lunch for the remaining weeks of this year. While it is impossible to list all the generous donors and volunteers in this article, we do want to acknowledge the following businesses and organizations who have been instrumental in helping us this summer: Rindge Woman's Club, RAMS, The First Congregational Church of Jaffrey, and Data Axle.



Newfoundland Ponies



Against all odds, Ammy's Honour and Highland Snow Storm, two critically endangered Newfoundland Ponies, overcame physical and environmental challenges and created a beautiful filly. She was born at 10pm on July 21st, 2021 at one of our local foster farms. Her name is Ammy's Islay Storm. (Pronounced "eye la".) We are ecstatic.

You see, when he was just 5 years old, Ammy was seriously injured, kicked by a horse at a former farm, badly fracturing his femur. We took Ammy in fully aware that the kindest thing to do was to euthanize him. It was heartbreaking to see him so

broken. But our vet said he was small, young, and the fracture had fused. She felt we should give him a chance.

Ammy is now 15 years old. For most of the 10 years since the fracture, he couldn't bend his right rear leg. However his will to live was incredible. He adapted and was an inspiration for many children and adults facing challenges, a reason for never giving up.



A year ago a kind woman from Four Paws Reiki came to help the ponies. By golly, after 6 months, Ammy could slightly bend that leg! In fact he could stand on his back legs a bit, and that was enough to create this beautiful filly with Storm.

Islay's foster is a Canadian citizen, living here in the USA. His grandparents were born and raised in Newfoundland, west coast. His Nana lived in Codroy, NL. His Grandfather lived in Chamel Port Aux Basque, on the southwest tip and was in the merchant marines. His grandfather's brother, Hubert, ran the lighthouse.

Ammy himself came from the island of Newfoundland, and to the USA when he was 4.

This birth is extra special to NPCC since Ammy, try as we might using alternative reproduction processes, has not been able to have a foal to pass his wonderful traits, his genetics to the future.

This birth is also extra special to our foster who feels so blessed to have had a Newfoundland Pony, symbolic of his roots, born at their New England farm.

We have many people to thank for this. Sometimes it really does take a village to make something so beautiful happen.

Welcome to the world, Ammy's Islay Storm! We've been waiting for you for a very long time!



Rindge Nears Purchase of Conservation Land

Protecting Land and Water for the Future

One year ago, the outlook for purchasing Rindge Stone & Gravel for conservation land appeared bleak. The owner had just announced the sale of his property to a commercial gravel operation. Rindge Conservation Commission didn't give up. Its persistence is paying off.



Earlier this summer the Town of Rindge signed a Purchase and Sale Agreement for nearly 225 acres of the Rindge Stone and Gravel property. Completion of the purchase is expected before the end of the year. The land, which will be conserved and opened to the public for recreation, will also preserve wetlands that protect our water supplies and help prevent flooding. The Conservation Commission has covered a lot of ground this summer. In addition to a signed agreement, the land has a clean bill of health from an Environmental Assessment and a boundary survey is nearly complete. Funding for the land purchase is confirmed.

According to Al Lefebvre, Conservation Commission Secretary, "The people of Rindge really stepped up with generous donations. We were able to qualify for an anonymous \$25,000 matching donation." Additional funding is from State grants, private foundations and in-kind services.

Two important steps remain in the coming months. The Rindge Conservation Commission will finalize the conservation easement with Monadnock Conservancy and complete legal documents for transferring the property. These pave the way for Town residents to enjoy hiking, hunting, cross-country skiing, snowmobiling, horseback riding and other activities in this natural environment for years to come.

The impact isn't just with the riders either, CVTC volunteer drivers have the most uplifting stories to tell about their own experiences giving rides. The gift of giving doesn't just serve the recipient." Asked how her time in the parks and recreation field will benefit her in this new position, Sangermano responded, "My heart is in serving others and I look forward to utilizing the marketing and relationship building skills I honed during my parks and recreation days to expand regional awareness of CVTC's mission and impact. CVTC is truly a neighbor helping neighbor, local organization and I am thrilled to be part of it."



CVTC Executive Director Ellen Avery says "Renee is the perfect candidate for this position. She is a graduate of Leadership NH in 2020-2021, and Leadership Monadnock 2018. These experiences provide her with a working knowledge and professional connections throughout the region and the state. Her parks and recreation experience in Rindge and Jaffrey will only strengthen CVTC's relationships with our service towns. We are so fortunate!" Funding for this position is provided by the Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) Healthcare Access Workgroup Implementation Funds through the Center for Population Health at Cheshire Medical Center.

CVTC provides "no fee" transportation. Rides to non-emergency medical and social service appointments, grocery shopping and other basic needs are provided by Volunteer Drivers. CVTC provides accessible rides for people whose mobility is dependent on a wheelchair.


The Clark Y campus includes the fitness center, six lane pool, gymnasium, field house, gymnastics center, before and after school child care center and soccer fields.


