



Conservation Commission Highlights

Workdays/Fun Days, Hikes, and Signs

THANK YOU to Conservation Corps members and Commission Friends who helped clean up this past winter's extensive storm damage on our town's conservation lands. Now, the Commission has a back-log of planned projects to complete before cold weather. We have a BIG ask. Can you help keep our conservation properties among the best in the Monadnock Region?

The Commission is scheduling monthly workdays (we like to call them fun days) on the second Saturday of each month-two shifts, 8:00-10:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m.-Noon. Interested in joining the fun on September 9, October 14, or November 11? Email rindgeconcom@town.rindge.nh.us and we will send you details on each workday's plans.

The Annual Hike and Paddle Series continues for two more outings. All hikes begin at 1:30 p.m. are free of characteristics.

Throughout September, four new nature signs will be installed along trails at Contoocook Marsh Conservation Complex to educate hikers on the importance of protecting the Contoocook Watershed.

hikes begin at 1:30 p.m., are free of charge, follow well-defined trails, and take place rain or shine. Reserve the dates on your calendar today!



October 15, Miriam Hunt Memorial Town Forest. Meet at the entrance located on Route 119
opposite Cutter Hill Road and Crowcroft Pond (about 2.5 miles east of US 202) to explore the reds,
yellows and oranges of bright fall foliage. We will be collecting cans and other goods for National
Food Bank Week. Donations will benefit Rindge Food Pantry.

Nature signs are coming to Contoocook Marsh Conservation Complex. With funding from Merrimack Conservation Partnership and Rindge Conservation Fund, four educational signs will be installed along the trail. The Contoocook Watershed and river begin in Rindge, so it is up to us to protect the water quality. Signs will highlight the Contoocook Watershed, Vernal Pools, Cyanobacteria, and Native Vegetation (nature's water purification system).

Get a Ride or Give a Ride: Everyone Benefits



Right down the road, right now, someone needs a ride to somewhere essential. And volunteer drivers for Community Volunteer Transportation Company (CVTC) drive people where they need to go.

When riders can keep their essential appointments, they stay independent, and can live at home in peace. Riders can request to be taken to their doctor's or social service appointments, pharmacy or grocery shopping; all non-emergency. A five business-days' advance notice is all CVTC needs to enter a rider's trip request in our TripList system. And for the rider, it is more than just the free ride. Our drivers are courteous and trustworthy, willing to converse and engage. Sometimes even new friendships are made.

Once our vetted volunteer drivers choose which trips best fit their schedule, they call the rider to verify pick-up times and when they return home themselves, they track their total mileage for reimbursement at \$0.655 per mile from CVTC. Drivers select when, and to where, and for how long they are available. By making this difference in a rider's life, drivers contribute to the health of the Monadnock Region, one person at a time. 

Rindge Historical Society and Museum



Here in Rindge, we have a Museum established to collect, curate, and preserve town historical documents, photographs, and artifacts. It is located at 24 School Street, and was established by Mary Lee Ware in 1895 in the attic of the newly built town library. The current President of the Board is Karla MacLeod, whose family has lived and worked in Rindge since 1820! Karla's great-great grandmother Hoyt lived at one time in the building, which now houses the Museum collection, and Karla developed her interest in the history of her town and family at an early age. Karla says that 'you

can't hang on to what you had before, but you can get glimpses of it'. This is a sentiment that many Rindge residents, both natives and new arrivals, will appreciate.

There is an interesting arrangement between the town and the Historical Society. The town owns the artifacts, and the Society owns the building. There are no paid workers, and the 14 members of the Board volunteer their time, talents, and monetary contributions to support the work being done. An annual allotment of \$4,100 is given to the Society by the town. The Board also applies for a Hunt Foundation grant each year. This money is used for operating expenses, as well as in preparing items for display, purchasing new items, and caring for the property. Recently the Society received a substantial bequest from a former board member,



which they are using to update the windows, septic system, and porch. Fund-raising efforts include the sale of books and booklets about historic events, woven blankets that display town landmarks, and donations at the Open Mic events.





The Museum is open to the public on the first Saturday of each month from 10am to 2pm, and every Wednesday from 10 am to 12 noon. Coffee and goodies are offered on Wednesdays, and people are invited to enjoy a comfortable and welcoming chair on the wrap-around porch on warm summer or crisp fall days. Tours can be arranged at other times by calling the Museum phone number. Karla can also be reached by personal phone and email, all of which are listed on the Society's website. People conducting historical and genealogical research will find a wealth of material in the Museum's extensive records, dating back to the mid-1700's. And please look for the Historical Society display case at the Ingalls Memorial Library! It currently features historic lighting, and a new display is coming soon featuring early music.





Karla's efforts extend beyond the preservation of the artifacts, to the care of the property, consisting of the original barn and surrounding lawns and gardens. The barn may become the venue for the Open Mic, which is currently held from 1pm to 4pm on the 4th Saturday of each month at The Meeting House or museum grounds. Karla also arranges for students at the Memorial School to take tours and learn about the history of their town. I found it quite startling to learn that Rindge, which was first settled in 1750, had reached a peak of 1,400 people by 1820. A decline then set in, and by 1930 there were only 600 residents!

Come to the Museum, and find out why the population rose and fell so abruptly! (Hint- water power, sheep farms, woolen mills) At our museum, there is a story behind each item, and something of interest for every person who steps back in time through the doors of this memorable organization.

Tennis/Pickleball Court Challenge

The Rindge Woman's Club would like to offer a challenge to local non-profits, businesses, and individuals to join us in supporting our youth and the health and fitness of our neighbors by donating to rebuild the Tennis/Pickleball courts at the Recreation Department on Wellington Road. At Town Meeting this year voters set aside twenty thousand dollars to establish a fund to completely rebuild the tennis/pickleball courts at the Rindge Recreation Center at Wellington Park. Rebuilding the courts is estimated to cost about \$140,000.

Several years ago, the Recreation Center built a portable ice-skating rink to go over the tennis courts during the winter months. Unfortunately, the supporting structure of the tennis courts was unable to bear the weight of the ice rink and several deep cracks and fissures have opened. Repairing the cracks and resurfacing the courts is no longer an option as the foundation for the courts is crumbling. We need to rebuild the courts completely.







At our August 3rd meeting of the Rindge Woman's Club, we discussed the state of the tennis/pickleball courts and voted to donate \$2,000 toward the fund to rebuild the courts. We've heard that people are working on grant opportunities to support the ONLY public tennis courts in Rindge, but we know that often these grants require matching funds. 
